LOOKING AFTER NATURE SO NATURE CAN LOOK AFTER YOU



Down on the Farm at Lockerley Estate.

The farm has been busy this month taking advantage of the dry weather conditions and has drilled all spring crops, apart from the peas which need warmer soil temperatures. Another step on our journey for improving soil health was using a direct drill to establish the spring beans, which moved very little soil, conserved moisture and stored carbon. Another change on the estate is in the way we manage our woodland. We have around 570 acres of woodland ranging from trees planted in the last five years to areas of ancient semi natural woodland with some veteran trees of a great age, one Yew having been estimated at approximately 1000 years old! Woodland habitat is an important ecosystem which is home to many species of flora and fauna. The greater diversity of habitat types leads to the widest biodiversity, so a woodland of mixed age and species is the ideal. For this reason, we have changed the way we manage our woodland to a Continuous Cover system where, as the name suggests, we will not 'clearfell' areas of trees but will open up areas within established woodland and encourage a mixed under storey either through planting or natural regeneration. Harvesting of timber still takes place, with a little more care required, to generate all important income. In the polytunnel at Manor farm, the propagating benches are groaning under the weight of seedlings - trays of potential everywhere you look! The vegetable beds are filling up nicely now too; the potatoes are well on their way, as are the beans, peas and leafy greens. We're also pleased to report that the irrigation system is almost complete, the fruit cage has been built and work has started on the Veg Shed fit out. We look forward to welcoming you there very soon. And whilst you're waiting on all that lovely veg, there are freshly cut estate daffodils for sale at the West Tytherley Village Shop. 
A reminder of The Countryside Code, from East Tytherley Parish Council:




