Your First Responder team is limited in size and it has been reported that fewer people are presenting at A&E or their GP with symptoms of a heart attack. We need to raise £1,800 for the machine. Stuart Pascoe died at home in June at the age of 99 years, after a short illness. A Friend from the inception of FOBW, he built the Barn, made lots of signboards, coupe signs, bird and dormouse nest boxes, helped get dormouse monitoring going, was on the Advisory Group from 1989, attended hundreds of Friends' events, AGMs, BBQs and Xmas parties and was a true Friend of Bentley Wood to the very end of his life.

The sad news of Tony Horner's death in October will have reached many of you. Tony knew Bentley Wood from his youth, was a Friend and Advisory Group secretary from BW's earliest days then Advisory Group chairman from 2001. He was appointed a BW Trustee in 1998. Involved in the butterfly and bird recording and leading the popular dawn and dusk bird walks for many years, he encouraged children and adults to enjoy BW as much as he did himself.

The Volunteer Programme halted in March but was restarted, with strict Covid 19 guidelines, in August. You may have seen them at work or noticed that the Orchid Path is being widened and the Barn has been re-preserved. The Volunteers have stopped temporarily during this current lockdown but will continue over the winter if Government Guidelines and local infection rates allow.

If you are a dog owner or dog walker, please do take your poo bags home with you. There is no one to collect them up. Most people of course do so, but if everyone did so the Wood would benefit.

If you are a walker (or cyclist), it would be much appreciated if you could keep to the line of the bridleway down the northern edge of the wood, avoiding detours into the wood where there are no tracks. There are a number of sensitive wildflower sites bordering this bridleway and these are easily damaged.




