## The Stone Soup

The Veg Shed team are sharing one of their go-to-recipes with us. Others can be found on their Facebook page (@VegShedLockerley) and Instagram (@hellovegshed).

There is a wonderful alchemy in soup-making, bringing together simple and inexpensive ingredients in just the right way to create something warming and wholesome.

The Stone Soup is a European folk tale, which is often told to children to demonstrate the value of sharing what we have and collaborating to create something better than we could achieve on our own. The story has been told in various ways but the basic plot is as follows: A traveller arrives in a village, carrying an empty cooking pot. The villagers are unwilling to share any of their food so the traveller fills the pot with water, drops a large stone in it and places it over a fire. One of the villagers asks what the traveller is doing. He answers that he is making 'stone soup' which is delicious and would be willing to share with the villages although it still needs 'something' to improve the flavour. One of the villagers, liking the sound of this, does not mind parting with a few carrots so these are added to the soup. Another villager walks by, inquiring about the pot and the traveller again explains that the stone soup needs a little something more to reach its full potential. More and more villagers walk by, each adding another ingredient. Finally, the stone is removed and a delicious and nourishing pot of soup is enjoyed by traveller and villagers alike.

Trickery aside, our local communities have many great examples of people coming together to offer something to the 'pot' which combined provides something bigger for everyone to enjoy. The village Lunch Club brings local people together to enjoy the company of their neighbours over a home-cooked meal. The Veg Shed will be providing the vegetables for the Friday lunches and we are very proud to be supporting such a great community initiative.

Some of the recipes available from the Veg Shed include: Carrot, Honey & Ginger Soup; Bloody Beetroot Soup; and a Winter Veg Broth. They are also looking for YOUR go-to soup recipes.

The Veg Shed is open Thursday – Saturday, 10am-5.30 offering lots of seasonal veggies, all grown without chemicals and pesticides. They also have an offer of 5 items for £5 at 5pm every Saturday! Ideal for batch baking soup for the rest of the week. They also offer a weekly veg box delivery.
