

## Butts Green, Lockerley

Lockerley parish council are pleased to advise that by the time you receive this newsletter, work will have started to enclose Butts Green with 'dragons' teeth'. If you recall, this process has been a long time in the making, but we now have the funds and resources available. The reason for installing dragon's teeth is to prevent incursions and further damage to the green. The plan includes parking for approximately 30 cars and there will also be two gates at either end of the green to allow vehicular access to the green for village and school events. We have received some offers to donate trees and benches for the green, thank you. It is our intention that these changes to the green will only serve to enhance the pleasure and safety of the green, for all to enjoy.

The parish council have planned the car parking area primarily for the benefit of parents at the school and for village hall users, if necessary. The parking area is not intended for any business use. The parish council do ask that anyone using the parking area adhere to the following conditions please, in order that the facility may benefit everyone:

- 1) No overnight parking
- 2) 4 hour maximum stay
- 3) Maximum weight limit of 1.5tons/1500kgs
- 4) Parking needs to be perpendicular to the road


