He said he had grown up in the village and remembered attending Sunday School in the church. His name was Ken Galton. He is now 89, and lives near Fareham. He said he had been a hurdle maker all his life and is still involved in caring for woodland areas. Yvonne mentioned this to June Wickham and John Jannaway, both of whom remembered him clearly as did Cecil Hatchett who lived on Lockerley Green and now lives in Australia . A few days later, John Jannaway contacted Yvonne to say that Ken had been awarded the British Empire medal in the King's New Years Honours list for services to Hazel Coppicing and Heritage crafts. This is recorded in the Southern Daily Echo of 31st December 2024.

King Edward's Hall - Emergency Generator

The generator in the hall will be turned on when there is a prolonged power cut of at least three hours during the day, or when there is notification by SSE in advance of a future power cut. It will of course be turned on if there is an event running in the hall. In all cases it will be turned off by 11 pm except in extreme emergency situations. A team of volunteers are trained in starting up the generator. Please note that it does not automatically switch on because of the solar panels.

The Hall is part of the resilience plan to create a warm hub in the village where everybody can congregate to make hot drinks, heat food up, recharge mobile devices, laptops etc. (Please bring your own charger). Virgin internet should also work. Mobile coverage is dependent on the mast. There will no longer be a password needed for the hall internet.

The defibrillator should also be able to work and the password for opening the box is on the hall notice board and inside the telephone box. This ensures that there is immediate access to the device but it is still necessary to ring 999. The telephone box should also work.

The children demonstrated creativity and empathy as they built new homes for these woodland inhabitants, further nurturing their connection to nature."





Candlemas (2nd February) is a Christian feast day commemorating the presentation of Jesus at the Temple by Joseph and Mary (falling on the 40th Day of Christmas). It is based upon the account of the presentation of Jesus in Luke 2:22-40. While it is customary for Christians in some countries to remove their Christmas decorations on Twelfth Night (Epiphany Eve), those in other Christian countries historically remove them after Candlemas. On Candlemas, many Christians also take their candles to their local church, where they are blessed and then used for the rest of the year. February is traditionally associated with romantic love – we remember the life and witness of St Valentine (on 14th February). According to legend, he was a Roman priest, martyred for his faith in the early days of the church because he had secretly married Christian couples. In another legend, he signed his letter to a friend "from your Valentine", which may be the origin of the cards we send today. We may never know the full details of St Valentine's story but we remember him for his faithful witness to the gospel at a time when Christians were undergoing brutal persecution for their faith.
